Minutes of Meeting 2nd District 80 Council Meeting (DCM II) 9th May 2020, Saturday ♦ 4.00 pm – 6.30 pm Online Meeting conducted through Zoom

1. Calling of meeting to order and Welcome Address by District Director

The 2nd DCM was called to order at 4:38 p.m. by the Chair, District Director (DD) Ernest Chen DTM. He acknowledged that while the meeting started late, the important thing was that it got started. He welcomed all to the second and last council meeting of the term.

He noted that while the implementation of COVID-19 measures have restricted movements, this has allowed us to learn something new in online meetings and new technology.

He said that the district has done well this year given the constraints of physical meetings being disallowed and hence we should never give up hope.

He welcomed the following distinguished visitors to our online meeting:

He also thanked the Zoom Masters for their support and the attendance of all for the meeting.

Technical In-charge Nurhakim ACB CL briefed all on the procedure on using the 'raise hand' function in Zoom for permission to speak.

2. Reading of District Mission by Club Growth Director

Club Growth Director (CGD) Jackson Chua DTM read the District Mission.

5. Report from Admin. Manager – Confirmation of Minutes and Matters Arising

DD referred all to the Minutes of Meeting of the 1st District Council Meeting (DCM I) Meeting held on 14 September 2019, sent to district council members via email on 25 April 2020 and also disseminated before the meeting through the Zoom Chat function.

6. Update of Appointed District Officers – District Director

DD gave an update for the following appointments:

Naveen Giri EH1 has taken over the duties of G4 Area Director from Iman Yusoff who stepped down.

S1 Area Director is S1 Siti Marsita Atan PM3 with effect from August 2019.

U5 Area Director is Srinivasan Sohien DL1 with effect from February 2020.

District Audit Chair is Amar Asrani EH2 with effect from March 2020.

Other members in the new Audit Committee are Ching Kwock Weng DTM and Barbara Kang CC ALB.

7. Mid-Year Report – District Audit Chair

District Audit Chair Amar Asrani EH2 presented the mid-year report, saying that the District has been prudent: there is money saved and a healthy balance of more than \$59,000 in net income as at 31 December, referring to the amount shown on the screen and report.

In the preparation of the report, he had reconciled the figures for all Concur transactions.

8. 3rd Quarterly Report ending March 2020 – District Finance Manager

Audit Chair Asrani presented this report on his behalf of District Finance Manager Arun Sharma CC CL.

The balance is healthy with a total net income of over \$84,000. The expenditure is less than budgeted.

DD further added that many of the funds remained to be claimed.

To CGD Jackson Chua DTM's query on whether the report was approved by Toastmasters International (TI), DD answered that it was sent, pending approval.

9. District Alignment Committee Report & Adopt Clubs' Alignment - District Alignment Chair

District Alignment Chair Tay Yiang Ping DTM presented her alignment report that was dated 19 April and revised on 29 April due to some changes. It was based on statistics reported on dashboard on 18 April. She said that any changes since then would likely be minor.

The alignment changes would take effect on 1 July 2020.

She stated that the alignment strategies follow TI HQ guidelines and are based on current position of club performance. Her committee consists of PQD Ng Cher Khim DTM, past District Alignment Chair Helen Lee DTM and 11 Division Directors,

Her team encountered difficulties due to corporate clubs not meeting because of COVID-19. She thanked the division directors in contacting all the affected clubs.

She confirmed that all affected clubs had agreed to the alignment, as required for the changes to take place. Although some alignment proposals were not agreed upon in the first instance, the alignment committee voted for a decision; the PQD also contributed some ideas. Reports on the proposed changes were sent and division directors obtained the approval from affected clubs.

She then presented the alignment changes by division, highlighting the notes in yellow denoting the clubs affected:

- There would be no changes to Division E and T.
- There would be 5 areas instead of the current 6 for Division B, which has some suspended clubs.
- LCS would be realigned from B5 to D1 as they use the same venue at LLI as Money Mastery.
- Keysight Technologies would be realigned from area G2 to G1.
- JP Morgan would be realigned from area S2 to S1.
- Nee Soon East Mandarin Advanced Toastmasters would be realigned from Z2 to be with other Mandarin clubs at V6.
- Division L would see a change from 6 to 8 areas due to the expansion of 4 new clubs and charter of more clubs. There would be 16 clubs affected.
- Emmaus Catholic Toastmasters would be moved from U5 to A3.

She thanked the committee, division directors and clubs involved for their support.

10. Report – District Public Relations Manager

District Public Relations Manager Muhammad Nurhakim Bin Mohamed Yusop, ACB CL, reported that his public relations team, called the Wisdom Squad, has been organising many activities since the start of the term to support the district's mission and vision.

It started the term with "My Toastmasters Club's Exco" social media challenge to welcome and celebrate new exco members and develop camaraderie within the club to start the term on a high note. Participating toastmasters clubs garnered more than 600 likes from friends and families. This initiative has allowed clubs to showcase themselves to the public.

In October, the PR101 workshop was conducted by the trainers, Willie Loh DTM and Mohd Hijazi DTM, which achieved its aim to help clubs' exco and other members learn how to publicise their clubs and optimise Facebook search algorithm. Clubs reported an increase in visits in Facebook traffic and the trainers continued to help practise hands-on, professional design skills through the Canva platform and optimising their posting on Facebook.

Similar workshops were conducted for the Mandarin and other divisions.

In October, District webmaster John Lee conducted training on Facebook branding and marketing. He also led the revamp of the District's district page and the clean-up of its district group. There is now greater clarity

in the channels for reaching out to the public using the Facebook page, versus the use of Group for our own members.

To reflect the multi-ethnic landscape of the District, videos on festival celebrations in various languages were posted on Deepavali and Chinese New Year celebrations.

He also announced an ongoing PR campaign to show our gratitude to national frontline workers with a 1 – 2 minute video speech to motivate them.

To help clubs move to online meetings due to the COVID-19 restriction measures, the PR team supported the PQD to transport the online onboarding for hundreds of toastmasters clubs via the Zoom platform as replacement for face-to-face meetings.

150 bookings were handled in March, with an average of 2 per day. Where there was greater demand than supply, the divisions had stepped in to offer their accounts. PR team members also collaborated with Aaron Leung DTM on how to conduct virtual business meetings.

The term also witnessed the setting up of the first online toastmasters club in Singapore by Willie Loh DTM and other local toastmasters. While not under District 80, he opined that the club has helped connect local toastmasters to connect with overseas toastmasters and representing Singapore alongside with the district.

DPRM Nurhakim thanked all his team members: John Lee, Li Shan Shan , Marshall Cooper, Christophe Hamchin, Peter Ng, Raj Willie Ng , Celine Ong, Shirley Tham from the Wisdom Squad

11. Address by Club Growth Director

Referring all to page 15 of the report, Club Growth Director (CGD) Jackson Chua DTM presented his executive summary of club growth matters.

11.1 He congratulated 5 divisions for chartering 12 clubs in the term thus far. There are 221 clubs as the base number, so with 12, it should end up with 233. However, to date, we have 198 due to the loss of 35 clubs. There is a loss of 10% in club base and 7.8% in membership renewals.

He opined that the Covid-19 situation is a painful reality for clubs in Singapore and elsewhere, with other districts showing a similar trend worldwide.

11.2 Despite this, he encouraged all to continue striving as the term has not ended. Despite the difficulties, the club chartering mission will continue with the target of 8 more. He reported 6 in the pipeline and encouraged all divisions to strive to charter one each. He encouraged greater openness and collaboration in supporting one another and asked toastmasters to approach him to avoid duplicating resources.

11.3 In matters of club retention, he thanked clubs for trying to retain members and some clubs for having an informal exit strategy to understand the reasons for non-renewal. He urged all in the council to be patient and apply their passion to continue to do their best until the last day of June.

11.4 With clubs going online, he urged all to see the possibilities this move could bring.

He observed that some members' initial fears about accessing Pathways online were dispelled when they found it necessary to moved online to Zoom, highlighting the importance of believing that things can happen.

He suggested members refer to video resources in TI's website.

11.5 CGD also thanked all club coaches and informed all who want to be club coaches to apply with him up till the end of his term, and he will match them to help the weaker clubs.

He gave examples of successful turnaround of clubs such as Tampines West and Astro@Radin Mas when other clubs, such as Leng Kee Advanced and Cairnhill, helped.

He called on all to apply their knowledge and enthusiasm to encourage members and show that you care for them, saying that "Together, we can create better results."

12. Report – Program Quality Director

Program Quality Director (PQD) Ng Cher Khim DTM presented his updates on matters under his charge:

12.1 DOTs were conducted in July 2019, including two makeups. All Division Directors and 49 out of 53 Area Directors were trained.

Overall, 93.75% of District Officers were trained. The training report was submitted to TI on time.

12.2 All 11 divisions conducted their Club Officers' Training I (COT I) in July 2019, and the district conducted a makeup in August. 81.4% or 170 clubs have 4 or more officers trained.

Total, the district had 907 or 59.4% of club officers trained and the report was submitted punctually to TI.

12.3 All divisions conducted their COT2 before end-February 2020. There were 170 clubs with 4 or more officers trained in COT2. The total number of officers trained in COT2 is 839, or 51.7%.

All COT2 attendance reports were submitted to TI before TI deadlines.

12.4 Overall : 68.8% or 163 clubs with 4 or more officers were trained in both COTs

He commended Division L and V, which have all clubs with 4 or more officers trained in both COTs.

12.5 He listed four district workshops presented during DEC1 that were already held, including:

- Attracting Guests and Converting Guests to Members : completed on 21 Sep 2019
- Pathways – Beginner's hands-on sessions : completed on 14 Sep 2019
- Organising Quality Meetings : completed on May/June 2020
- Organising Quality Speech Contests : completed on 22 March 2020
- Judging Speech Contests Correctly : completed on 21 Dec 2019

He has also added 2 more workshops not announced in DEC1:

- How to Conduct Online Meetings : completed on 29 Feb 2020
- Learning from the World Champion : completed on 26 April 2020

12.6 For contests, District 80 will conduct 3 district level speech contests as announced in DEC1 and 2:

- International Speech
- Humorous Speech
- Table Topics

Most divisions have completed their speech contests in April and early May 2020.

The District Table Topics and Humorous Speech Contests will be held on 10 May 2020.

The District International Speech will be held on 16 May 2020.

12.7 District Annual Conference

The plan that started in Oct 2019 for a 2-day event with 10 speakers was cancelled on 11 March in consideration for the safety of our members.

Refunds for the over 180 tickets sold by then were given a full refund.

12.8 Distinguished Club Program (DCP)

The Program Quality Team targets to have 60% of clubs achieving Distinguished Club status through working with clubs and training workshops.

As of 5 May, there were 198 paid clubs but we require 239 clubs, meaning that another 39 clubs are needed to become Smedley Distinguished District. 1800 more membership payments are needed.

He observed that the district was on target before April renewal, showing two tables comparing the number of distinguished clubs and minimum 20 members or net growth of 5 members, which is a requirement for Distinguished Club status.

The number of clubs meeting the DCP educational requirements grew from 124 to 135 but those meeting the membership requirement dropped from 90 to 83. This means that many did not renew, which he attributed to online meetings.

He expressed the view that there is opportunity for online meetings but the problem is that there are very few non-Toastmasters guests. There is a need for clubs to publicise their meetings.

He outlined the immediate actions needed as follows:

1. Publicize meetings outside the Toastmasters community
2. Convert non-toastmaster guests to members
3. Bring back those who did not renew their membership in April.

He believed that it is still possible to reach the Smedley Distinguished District goal if we are successful in carrying out the above.

12.9 Pathways Adoption

PQD reported that District 80 has one of the lowest Pathways' adoption rates in the world, and 10% below the world average.

He outlined 4 reasons:

1. Some older members are not familiar with online technology or do not even not have email accounts.
2. Some members do Pathways projects without registering.
3. Some members focus on achieving education awards under the old system.
4. District Pathways team is too passive.

12.10 Education Award Achievements

PQD reported that as of 6 May, there were 66 DTMs as compared to 41 and 66 completed level 5 in Pathways compared to 47 in 2018/19.

He believes that the number of DTMs this term will double that of last term.

Other achievements this year include:

- 56 ACB
- 71 ACG
- 281 Triple Crown achievers

He concluded that for education and training, all events were carried out as planned except for the Annual Conference. He reiterated that the actions needed now are:

- to help more clubs become distinguished
- for clubs to recruit more members and bring back ex-members

13. Report – District Director

13.1 DD Ernest Chen DTM stated that at the start, the district had high hopes. Amidst the situation of clubs wanting to close, it was decided that the strategy would be to open more clubs while determining if some clubs can be helped to reverse their decision to close.

He commended the capability and commitment of the PQD, CGD and Division Directors.

13.2 He noted that some corporate clubs and their members did not renew due to the economic downturn.

Besides, without physical meetings, it is difficult to charter corporate clubs.

Some experienced members want to continue on the old educational path to get their DTMs, resulting in our lower Pathway rate.

13.3 With two months to go, he urged all not to give up hope. Together, the district can travel far and make things great.

He thanked the SDOs for their contribution.

14. Report – District Leadership Chair

District Leadership Chair Patrick Oei DTM PID presented the District Leadership Committee's Report.

14.1 He introduced his committee as consisting of Division Directors. They held online and physical meetings and deliberated on the suitability of candidates who had stepped forward to be district leaders next term. He thanked the candidates for their willingness to serve.

14.2 He reported that the committee had interviewed and unanimously decided on the following nominees for these positions:

- District Director : Ng Cher Khim
- Program Quality Director : Robert Ng
- Club Growth Director : Kathy Toh and Niza Khalil
- Division A Director : Raymond Zhang
- Division B Director : Julie Ong
- Division D Director : Li Shan Shan
- Division E Director : Muhammad Nurhakim
- Division G Director : Terence Nunis
- Division L Director : Alicia Yong
- Division S Director : no nominations at the closing date of nominations but since then a floor candidate has stepped up.
- Division T Director : Chinnappan Arulkumar
- Division U Director : Vernon Lim
- Division V Director : Yu Mei Hua
- Division Z Director : no nominations at the closing date of nominations but since then a floor candidate has stepped up.

He stressed that it does not mean that the candidates who are not selected as nominated candidates this year will not be suitable at another time can equip people to be ready for leadership such as emotional and leadership quotients.

14.3 The District Leadership Chair stated that the three floor candidates had been vetted by the DLC and it is the view of District Leadership Committee to vote for the nominated candidates.

15. Nominations and Election of District Officers for 2020 – 2021

15.1 DD briefed the council on the rules for the online District Council Meeting election.

Before the election, the following questions/comments were taken from the floor:

- Area U4 Director Muslim Sahib asked if all people in this room have voting rights.
DRPM Nurhakim replied that non-voting toastmasters would be moved them into the waiting room.
- Area U3 Director Go Ka Diam ACS, ALB : asked if a club’s VPE cannot attend, would the club only have one vote, to which DD replied that there would be no online proxy allowed, as confirmed by TI two days before the election. Ka Diam and Area U5 Director Srinivasan Sohien suggested that another email before the elections should have been sent to clarify this.
- DD reported that credentials team had rigorously checked the eligibility of those in the room based on the number of votes that they are entitled to under the rules.

15.2 DD gave directions to the council on how to vote and the conduct of candidates’ election speeches.

DRPM Nurhakim briefed the audience on how to vote, supported by a trial poll. He stated that although the trial poll was given a 2-minute duration, the actual vote would be given 5 minutes. He stated that during the actual vote, those not eligible for voting would be sent into the waiting room.

At this point, DLC Chair Patrick Oei DTM PID raised a comment that special appointment holders and observers should not get to vote. Hakim repeated his earlier statement that this would be taken care of with the breakout room system.

At the suggestion of Senthil Kumar, ACS ALB, the quorum was announced at this juncture. Credentials Chair Goh Sor Hoon DTM confirmed that the quorum was met at 198 at the time of certification against the requirement of 135.
